	The Hellenistic period (323-31 BC) is remembered above all for the conflicts between the kingdoms that had emerged from the empire of Alexander the Great and the Roman conquest of the Greek world. However, the famous cities of Athens and especially Sparta are generally associated with decadence and decline during this period, compared to a 'golden age' that is still all too often		









mythologised today. And yet, Sparta, even if it no longer holds a hegemonic position, remains an important player in the Hellenistic Mediterranean, a fact that has not been sufficiently recognised by scholars. Therefore, through a methodology based on the convergence of written and material sources, this project aims to fill a major historiographical gap, by lifting the veil on what is traditionally known as the 'Spartan mirage' and by attempting to uncover the historical realities about this famous Greek city beyond the myths and clichés.

The Hellenistic era was a time of profound internal reform in Sparta, and a time when the city also attempted to rewrite its history and create new dynamics. The available sources, which are scattered throughout the Mediterranean, point to a reorganisation of Spartan networks and relations with other cities. This occurred through the circulation of objects, people and cults, as well as ideas and symbols, some of which were based on supposedly shared ethnic and cultural identities and origins. These recompositions created a new 'Spartan Mediterranean' that was different from the previously existing one. Indeed, in parallel, Sparta developed other ambitions outside the Peloponnese to (re)create a new geopolitical and cultural destiny in the Mediterranean. The Hellenistic period was thus a time of profound reinvention for Sparta, which has not yet revealed all its secrets.
